**General waste**

## General waste includes:

- › Diapers and sanitary napkins
- › Hardback books
- › CDs/DVDs
- › Fat (cooking oil and frying fat)
- › Wrapping paper
- › Glass, other than packaging
- › Rubber and leather
- › Pet faeces, cat and bird litter (small amounts)
- › Ovenproof dishes
- › Cold ashes (well wrapped)
- › Crystal
- › Cosmetics
- › Food
- › Greaseproof paper
- › Plastic that isn't packaging
- › Porcelain
- › Mirrors
- › Needles/syringes (well wrapped in newspapers, drinks bottles, etc.)
- › Vacuum cleaner bags
- › Soup sachets
- › Soiled paper/cardboard
- › Soiled plastic packaging

**MUST BE DISPOSED OF IN A SEALED PLASTIC BAG**

- › Paper towels/napkins
- › Broken windows (well wrapped)
- › Polystyrene (large amounts may be brought to Heggstadmoen Recycling Centre)

**NB! All waste must be bagged**



**Paper and cardboard**

## Paper includes:

- › Newspapers
- › Paperback books
- › Milk cartons (rinse and fold, pack several into one carton)
- › Egg cartons
- › Juice and dessert cartons
- › Envelopes (including those with windows)
- › Food packaging (pizza boxes, etc.)
- › Advertising flyers etc.
- › Writing paper
- › Magazines
- › Washing powder boxes

**MUST BE DISPOSED OF AS LOOSE ITEMS**

## Cardboard includes:

- › Corrugated cardboard
- › Cardboard boxes (tear in pieces or fold flat)

**NOTE: Dispose of large quantities of cardboard at a recycling point or Heggstadmoen Recycling Centre**



**Plastic packaging**

## Plastic packaging includes:

- › Food trays (for meat, poultry, etc.)
- › Ice cream tubs
- › Plastic cartons (for sour cream, yoghurt, etc.)
- › Plastic bottles and corks (non-refundable)
- › Plastic wrapping (e.g. packaging for furniture)
- › Plastic cans/bags/tubs (e.g. soup tubs)
- › Shampoo/conditioner bottles
- › Chocolate wrappers
- › Soap packaging

**CLEAN AND IN A SEALED BAG**

The following are general waste:

- › Polystyrene
- › Firewood netting
- › Strapping bands
- › Plastic that isn't packaging



**Hazardous waste**

## Hazardous waste includes:

- › Batteries
- › Bleach, chloride, ammonia
- › Car and boat care products
- › Packaging for hazardous waste
- › Light bulbs and energy saving light bulbs (whole)
- › Used rags/cloths with solvents (placed in a sealed container with water.)
- › Mercury thermometers
- › Fluorescent tubes (leave beside box in original packaging.)
- › Paint, laquer, stain, glue
- › Paint and laquer remover
- › Plant treatment chemicals
- › Small electric appliances (Smoke detectors, mobile phones, etc.)
- › Aerosols
- › Oil and tar waste
- › White spirit, methylated spirits
- › Electrical and battery-powered toys
- › Ammunition and explosives must be handed over to the police
- › Old/unused medicines must be returned to a chemist/pharmacy
- › Needles and syringes are disposed of as general waste (well wrapped)



**Glass/metal**

## Glass and metal packaging includes:

- › Aluminium trays
- › Baby food jars
- › Tin/aluminium cans
- › Jam/food jars
- › Non-refundable bottles (soft drinks, wine, etc.)

Glass and metal must be taken to a recycling point. Visit [www.trv.no](http://www.trv.no) to find your nearest recycling point.
